## AMATEUR RADIO CLASS

#### **NEW TECHNICIAN PRIVILEGES**

In a recent report via ARRL newsletter, it has been mentioned that there is some confusion among the Technician class licensees as to what their new privileges on HF actually are. Here is a quick overview of the new HF privileges for Technicians as of February 23, 2007.

Technicians have no phone privileges on any HF band other than 10 meters. This includes Digital Voice Communications.

On 10 meters, Technician and Novice licensees have CW, RTTY and data privileges from 28.000 to 28.300 MHz, and CW and SSB privileges from 28.300 to 28.500 MHz. There are no FM privileges allowed.

In addition, Technicians and Novices only have CW privileges from 3.525 to 3.600 MHz on 80 meters, from 7.025 to 7.125 MHz on 40 meters and 21.025 to 21.200 MHz on 15 meters.
