Field Day 1967

Field Day was a big production. This particular one was at the American Legion Freedom Farm (many were at Freedom Farm) on Jefferson Road past our repeater site.

Ed Matysik, W9RQR, was Belleville's CD Director and was able to use one of CD's war surplus trucks, a "Deuce and a Half". The Friday before FD we'd go out to Scott Field and pickup 6 or 7 big green tents, the kind you would see on the TV show M*A*S*H if you watched. Those tents were probably 20' by 20', made out of very heavy canvas and had a large wooden pole that went thought the top center and a 5 foot pole on each corner. Saturday morning we meet at the Freedom Farm. A couple of guys went to the Civil Defense center to get the truck of tents and bring out the generator. The generator was a massive trailer mounted unit. I think it had a 4 or 6 cylinder automotive engine and had large truck tires on the trailer.

It would use upwards of 35 to 40 gallons of gas over the weekend. When it started to run low on fuel the line voltage would be all over the place! Most stations had custom made volt meters to keep an eye on the voltage! Setting up the tents was a chore and thank goodness most of the guys where in their late 40s or 50s and had served in the military and knew what they were doing. We had a great time at Field Day and just like lately, we had a lot of wet ones. We had a few accidents that could've been serious but fortunately were not. Dipoles were put up with bow and arrows or throwing weights into trees dragging fishing lines into the trees for a pull rope. Once someone swam across the lake at the Freedom Farm pulling a rope or wire behind them; anything for a better antenna! Thirty feet of Rohn tower was walked up and guyed, with a full size 20 meter beam mounted on top!

I was a Novice in 1967. George Hawk, WA9CEO (theory) and Ken Becker, WA9LED (code), taught the license class I was in.

FCC Proposes new fees for Amateur Radio!

Still no word on when this new fee will go into effect!

New information!!!! On August 16th an ARRL bulletin stated that the new fees will not go into effect before 2022! See: FCC Application Fees Unlikely to Go into Effect Until 2022 (arrl.org)

The FCC had proposed a \$50 fee for new or modified Amateur Radio licenses, license renewals and vanity call signs. With input from over 3,000 Hams, the ARRL, and other organizations, the FCC has decided a \$35 fee would be more reasonable.

The ARRL VE letter stated there are some FCC procedures that have to take place before the new \$35 fee will be in effect. The best guess is that it will be this summer.

If you or someone you know would like to upgrade or take their first test, do it sooner rather than later. Save the \$35.

FCC will will not accept SSN in lieu of FRN

ARLB014 FCC Auto-Registration Feature for Exam Applicants to be discontinued

Auto-registration in the FCC Commission Registration System (CORES) amateur radio exam for candidates using a Social Security number will be discontinued on May 20, 2021. Applicants must use an FCC Registration Number (FRN) for all license transactions with the FCC.

Examinees must register in CORES and receive an FRN before exam day.

Starting on May 20, electronic batch filed applications that do not include a candidate's FRN will be rejected. The Social Security/Licensee ID Field will be disabled.

An instructional video provides step-by-step instructions on how to establish a CORES account, which is necessary for licensees to make administrative updates and download electronic license authorizations.

FCC will require all appications to have an email address

After June 29, all filers must provide an email address on all applications. When an email is provided, applicants will receive an official electronic copy of their licenses once granted (allow incoming email from authorizations@fcc.gov). If no email is provided when filing on or after June 29, applications will be rejected. ARRL VEC suggests that those without access to email to use the email address of a family member or friend.

This is a QSL card I received from a Russian (Soviet Union) SWL in 1970. Unlike the Popular Electronics SWL (club?) this was a state sponsored operation. I believe prospective Hams were required to get a number of QSLs from intercepts they made. He heard me working LA2SM at the time on 15 meters. I understand they had to build their own receivers or use a radio club's. His card says his receiver has 17 tubes! He requested I QSL to P.O. Box 88, Moscow, USSR. The QSL was a stock card with his id rubber stamped on the front. Notice it celebrates the 50th anniversary of the Soviet Union.

In the late 60's and early 70's, DX was easy for me into Europe. I used a 40 Meter dipole and an EICO 720 which was about 40 – 50 watts out.
