Guys,

We were back home in Belleville, IL a week or so ago and, as we always do when we visit there, we got together for dinner with our ham friends from the 60's. In the picture above are Bob Heil, K9EID, Karl Bretz, K9BGL, Dave Bobzin, K9ZHN and me. Dave was my High School freshman German and Algebra teacher. He wanted to get a ham license and got a number of his students interested in doing the same. We took code and theory classes together at the Civil Defense Center in town and finally got our novice licenses in June 1960. Karl and Ed Schaefer, K9JMA (SK) were seniors and were serious hams and very encouraging to us new hams. Bob lived in Marissa, IL and we used to talk with him on 6 and 2 meter AM. He had a big station there. Dave and I continued a close friendship and worked together to upgrade to Technician and General during the rest of my time in High School. He helped me troubleshoot my first transmitter, a Globe Chief, which I had built from a kit. He, Karl and Ed were my Elmers in those early days. We put up antennas, went to Scott AFB to participate in MARS events and scrounge parts, participated in Field Day and just about anything else hams did in those days.

During that time we were all active with the St. Clair Amateur Radio Club. I was an officer and published the SCAN each month on one of those smelly mimeograph machines with my brother doing the cartoons for the cover. Many of us volunteered at the CD Center when there were tornado alerts handling traffic nets and manning the stations there. They had nice equipment and it was fun to use.

I remember getting the call from Eddy Matisyk, W9RQR, (SK), the head of Civil Defense for the county, to come to the CD Center on a hot, muggy summer evening when there was a serious threat of tornadoes.

The threat continued late and I ended up spending the night there and had to sleep in one of those spooky rooms deep in the bowels of that ancient building. It was all great fun and ham radio at its best. I stayed active in the SCARC throughout High School, and during the summers while in College and Law School. Field Day was always special and the club went all out for that event held each June at the American Legion Freedom Farm. There are many stories from those outings but that is for another time. Dave and Karl can fill you in on those.

I still treasure those memories and so much enjoy spending time with my great ham friends from the 60's who are still great friends today!
